



1. IMPORTANT NOTE


The college has not appointed any middlemen/ agents for admissions. The college will not be responsible if the students approach such touts.

Note that in BSc we offer 7 programs which are run on a grant-in-aid basis and 6 programs on non-grant basis. The details are in the table given in point 3.

The academic session will commence from 18th June 2024 as per the academic calendar received from Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur.

2. ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- The admission procedure is strictly on merit basis, as per university, government rules and through the college admission committee.
- b. The admission process is shown below:





- c. Following original documents need to be mandatorily submitted during admission:
 - i. Receipt of payment of ₹ 100/- towards college registration
 - ii. University registration receipt
 - iii. Leaving certificate from the school/college
 - iv. Statement of marks obtained in XII standard
 - v. Anti-ragging undertaking
 - vi. 75% attendance undertaking
- d. Attach self-attested photocopies of the following to the application form:

MANDATORY DOCUMENTS

- i. Leaving certificate from the school/college
- ii. Statement of marks obtained in XII standard
- iii. X standard passing certificate/diploma
- iv. Aadhaar Card

DOCUMENTS WHEREVER APPLICABLE

- i. Caste Certificate (for students belonging to SC, ST, NT/VJ, OBC, SBC, EWS, SEBC)
- ii. **Election photo identity card** (for students registered as voters)
- iii. Gap certificate (court affidavit stating that the student did not join any other institution after passing last university/ board examination. This affidavit is necessary only if there is a gap of one or more years between passing the last examination and joining the college.)
- iv. **Migration certificate** in the case of students who have passed their last qualifying examination of a university or a board other than RTM Nagpur university or Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education
- v. **Eligibility certificate from RTM Nagpur University** for students from university or board other than Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education
- vi. **Income certificate** of financial year **2023-24** from Gazetted Officer of State Government for students who wish to claim freeship/scholarship
- e. As per the ordinance No. 2 of RTM Nagpur University, Nagpur for admission to a college, the student shall produce the **original school/ college leaving certificate** signed by the head of the institution/ college last attended. This is required at the time of final admission. The original school/ college leaving certificate will be retained by the college for its permanent record and will not be returned in any case.
- f. The reservation of seats for backward class & physically handicapped students will be made as per the university directives.
- g. If the information has been suppressed in the application form and it comes to the notice of the college after admission at any time, the student will be liable to expulsion besides other action as may be deemed fit.

3. PROGRAMS OFFERED

With the implementation of National Education Policy 2020 (NEP 2020) from the session 2024-25, the students admitted to first semester of Bachelor of Science (Honors/ Research) program must study the courses mentioned in table 1:

Sr. No.	Course Type	Course Code	Choice for selection
1.	Major subject (Department/ subject Specific Core)	DSC	The student must successfully complete the DSC courses mentioned in table 2. These will include two theory and two practical courses.
2.	General Elective/ Open Elective	GE/ OE	The student must select two General Elective/ Open Elective courses, one each from table 3 and table 4. The GE/OE courses cannot be selected from the subjects chosen by a student as Major and Minor subjects.
3.	Vocational Skill Course	VSC	A student is required to successfully complete the Vocational Skill Course as mentioned in this scheme of examination. This course must be a course corresponding to the Major and/or Minor subject selected by a student.
4.	Skill Enhancement Course	SEC	A student is required to select a Skill Enhancement Course from the basket provided by the university for this purpose. The list of SEC courses is provided in table 5.
5.	Ability Enhancement Course	AEC	A student is required to study English Compulsory under AEC.
6.	Indian Knowledge System	IKS	A student is required to study Vedic Mathematics under IKS.
7.	Value Education Course	VEC	A student is required to study Environmental Science under VEC.
8.	Co-curricular course	СС	A student is required to select and successfully complete one Co-curricular Course mentioned in table 6.

Third semester onwards, the student is required to select one MINOR subject from any basket (groups A to E) except the basket from which she/he has selected the MAJOR program (subject).

4. ELIGIBILITY FOR B.Sc. SEMESTER I EXAMINATION

a. The candidate should have passed 12th Standard Examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education/ CBSE/ ICSE, with English at Higher or Lower level and any Modern Indian Language at higher or lower level together with any three science subjects comprised in the Faculty of Science or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto in such subjects and with such standards of attainments as may be prescribed;

OR

b. The candidate should have passed 12th Standard Examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary and offering Education in Vocational/Bi-focal Stream with one language only with any three science subjects comprised in the faculty of Science OR any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto in such subjects and with such standards of attainments as may be prescribed by Minimum Competency Vocational Courses (MCVC).

5. FEE STRUCTURE

The fee structure is subject to change as per government/ university decision from time to time. Every student who is admitted to the college is responsible for payment of tuition fees and other fees for the whole session irrespective of the date of his/ her admission or up to and inclusive of the month of leaving the college. The students desiring to leave the college in the middle of the session must intimate the principal accordingly in writing, otherwise the tuition fees will continue to be charged till the end of the session or the month of giving the intimation whichever is earlier. The detailed fee structure for the grant-in-aid programs is given on page 12:

^{*} Since NSS follows an annual calendar, the CC Marks can be claimed under any ONE of the two semesters for the academic year depending upon the availability of full assessment data of the student. Thus, NSS CC marks will be allotted during the CC falling in EVEN SEMESTERS. This also means that the NSS cadet must participate in any other activity from the basket i.e. from GAMES AND SPORTS or CULTURAL ACTIVITY simultaneously for claiming CC marks for a specific ODD semester.

6. **REFUND OF DEPOSIT**

Caution money and library deposits of the students will not be refunded if their names are on the college roll. The student should apply for a refund to the principal after getting it countersigned by his/her parents or guardian. All such applications will be considered after 1st August. The amount to be refunded will be decided after deducting all uncleared dues. Caution money and library deposit due for refund if not claimed within three years, will not be refunded.

7. FEES FOR COLLEGE LEAVING AND OTHER CERTIFICATES

- a. No fees will be charged for a college leaving certificate, if asked by the student within a year from the date of leaving the college or from the date of the result of the university examination for which the student appeared from the college. After this period a fee of ₹ 100/- will be charged for every subsequent year subject to a maximum of ₹ 500/-.
- b. The fees as shown below will be charged for each of the following certificates:

(i) Bona fide certificate	₹ 50/-
(ii) Attempt certificate of each examination	₹ 50/-
(iii) Date of birth certificate (as per available record)	₹ 50/-
(iv) Any other certificate	₹ 50/-

- Attested copies of the certificate submitted by the student at the time of admission will be issued c. on payment of $\stackrel{?}{\sim} 5/$ - for each certificate submitted.
- The student requiring a second copy of the college leaving certificate should state in writing as d. to what happened to the original certificate and why a second copy is required. He/ She will have to make an affidavit before a stipendiary magistrate in case the reasons given by the student are not found satisfactory. The student will have to pay fees of ₹ 100/- only for second copy. There is no provision of issue of college leaving certificate for third time.

8. **SHORT TERM COURSES (STC)**

Every year, the college conducts a short-term course for the students of semester I. This STC ensures that students gain the ability to exercise contemporary scientific knowledge in small, medium scale industry and service industry. Personality development program ascertains to inculcate the skill set in students to behave and become acceptable as an important contributor to the society. Soft skill training offers many benefits like- development of presentation skill, leadership skill, creativity, efficiency and teamwork. Students should understand the importance of ethical behavior and incorporate the same in their day to day working for which student will pay a nominal fee of ₹600/- at the time of admission for the complete short-term course.

9. CAREER KATTA

Career Katta is an initiative of Department of Higher and Technical Education, Govt. of Maharashtra in coordination with Maharashtra Information Technology Support Centre. Under the Career Katta, the college will continue conducting various activities to guide students about career, competitive examinations (UPSC, MPSC, Banking, SSB, SSC, Police, LIC, etc.), entrepreneurship, skill development, credit earnings under new CBCS and NEP Curriculum Framework, internship, and placement opportunities, etc.

Eligibility to join: any student admitted for any regular course in the college or college alumni referred by the college coordinator.

Registration Fees: a one-time fee of $\stackrel{?}{\sim}$ 365/- for a three-year degree period ($\stackrel{?}{\sim}$ 0.36 per day), which will be reimbursed in the form of subsidy on examination charges of CBCS. This fee includes free access to all the activities, courses, resources related to state level competitive exams, etc.

10. ACADEMIC BANK OF CREDIT (ABC)

After completing admission to BSc Semester I in college, it's mandatory for all students to create an ID on ABC. Download digilocker from Google Play Store. For more details, students may contact Prof. S.K. Giri in the Botany Department.

11. ATTENDANCE

- a. According to the NEP 2020 guidelines received from RTM Nagpur University, Nagpur one of the parameters of continuous internal evaluation is attendance and 05 marks are allotted to it.
- b. To qualify as candidate for university examinations, every student as a rule must attend not less than 75% of the lectures and practical delivered in every month in each of their subject of study. It will entirely be the responsibility of the students to keep up regular attendance. If the attendance is less than 75%, the name of each defaulter will be removed from the rolls. Fine of ₹ 20/- per day will be imposed on the student who remains absent from the college without permission.
- c. Applications submitted for the purpose of leave should be countersigned by the parent or guardian. Medical leave applications should be accompanied by a medical certificate.
- d. All applications for leave must be submitted within seven days from the last day of the leave period. Applications received later than this will not be considered at all.
- e. Leaves or absenteeism will be entirely at the student's own risk and a certificate of any kind will not condone a deficiency in attendance required by the university.
- f. The students getting scholarship or freeship are further warned that their scholarships or freeships will entirely depend on their regular attendance & satisfactory progress in studies. If a student belonging to aforesaid categories fails to put in 75% attendance, he/she will have to pay full fees irrespective of the ground of absence.
- g. Absence without leave from a college examination will entail a fine of $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{?}}$ 20/- per paper to a maximum of $\stackrel{?}{\stackrel{?}{?}}$ 100/- for one examination.

12. PARENT-TEACHERS MEETING

The college values the opinion of the parents and guardian and keep them informed about the development of their ward. Thus, in each session two parent-teachers' meetings will be held in the months of August and October (session I) and in February and April (session II), tentatively.

13. MEDICAL EXAMINATION AND PHYSICAL TEST

- a. Every student enrolled in the college according to the university rules, must present himself/ herself for medical inspection before the medical officer appointed by the college on such date as may be fixed by the medical officer in consultation with principal. The medical inspection of the students will be held in the premises of the college once in each academic year.
- b. A student who remains absent from medical examination and physical test at the appointed date and time without any sufficient cause shall be liable to pay to the college an extra medical examination fees of ₹ 100/- or such smaller amount as the principal may fix before he is examined.
- c. If a student fails to present himself/ herself for medical inspection without sufficient cause even after repeated opportunities, he/ she will have to pay fine of ₹ 100/- only.
- d. All the students admitted to college shall present themselves for physical efficiency test before the committee of examiners on such dates and at such time as may be fixed by the principal. Those who have joined Ranger & Rover (Scouts & Guides) may present themselves for physical efficiency test if they so desire. If a student fails to present himself for physical efficiency test without sufficient cause, he will be fined ₹ 100/-.

14. PHYSICAL EDUCATION

All students who opt for physical training shall attend the physical training period thrice a week in the prescribed uniform. They shall attend a minimum of 60 periods in a session. The classes will be held as per university and government instructions.

15. RULES OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

- a. All the students at the college should observe the rules of conduct framed by the college from time to time. Every day the students must attend the college in **proper uniform**.
- b. The students are directly answerable to discipline committee and the principal for their behaviour in general both inside and outside the college.
- c. The students should behave respectfully with their teachers and politely with their fellow students. Any act of ragging, disobedience, improper and discourteous exchange of words, use of indecent language or the passing of obscene remarks especially at the girl students is a punishable offence and will be viewed seriously.
- d. Smoking and chewing tobacco in classroom or college premises is strictly prohibited.
- e. Students should follow the **dress code** strictly.
- f. The **use of mobile phone in college premises is strictly prohibited** unless it is required for teaching-learning. If it is used in college premises a fine of ₹ 500/- will be imposed.
- g. Any **change either in the local or permanent address** of the student should be informed to the admission clerk so that regular contact with the student, parent or guardian is not hampered.

- h. No student shall directly send anything concerned with the college for publication either to press or elsewhere without the prior approval and the necessary permission from the principal of the college, nor shall approach the president or the College Development Committee (CDC) members except through the college principal. Any breach of the rule may lead to outright expulsion of the student from the college.
- i. The students should **read the notice board daily** for various notices that may be put from time to time and will leave the college premises as soon as their classes are over. No student shall bring any companion with him/ her who is not a student at this college.
- j. No excursions or tours shall be arranged by the students without the prior written permission of the principal. The attention of the parents/ guardians is especially invited to the fact that they should not permit their sons/ daughters/ wards to take part in the tour unless they confirm about the permission accorded by the principal.
- k. There shall be no social gathering, association, or committees of any sort in the college.
- I. The student shall also **not invite guests or arrange their lectures** on their own initiative.
- m. The students remaining absent without prior intimation in writing, are liable to be fined.
- n. The principal reserves the right to remove from the college roll, the name of any student for conduct which in the opinion of principal is unsatisfactory. A student or students may be expelled from the college for any act of indiscipline.
- o. Students must pay the college dues else they will not get their clearance.
- p. The student must come up to the academic standard (progress and attendance).
- q. Students shall observe all **safety precautions**. The college is not responsible for accidents of whatever nature in the college, laboratory, playground and during study tours.

Anti-ragging committee

What is ragging?

- 1. Any disorderly conduct whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling with rudeness a fresher or a junior student.
- Indulging in a rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student.
- 3. Asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not do in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

UGC has notified the anti-ragging regulations on curbing via 'Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009'. A nationwide toll free 24x7 anti ragging helpline 1800-180-5522 in 12 languages has been established which can be accessed by students in distress owing to ragging related incidents. UGC has developed the anti-ragging website i.e. www.antiragging.in. The portal contains record of registered complaints received and the status of the action taken thereon.

The senior students are advised to refrain themselves from any act of ragging. If the students feel that they are being ragged, they should kindly report the matter to the anti-ragging committee or principal or vice-principal.

17. GOI SCHOLARSHIPS AND FREESHIPS
