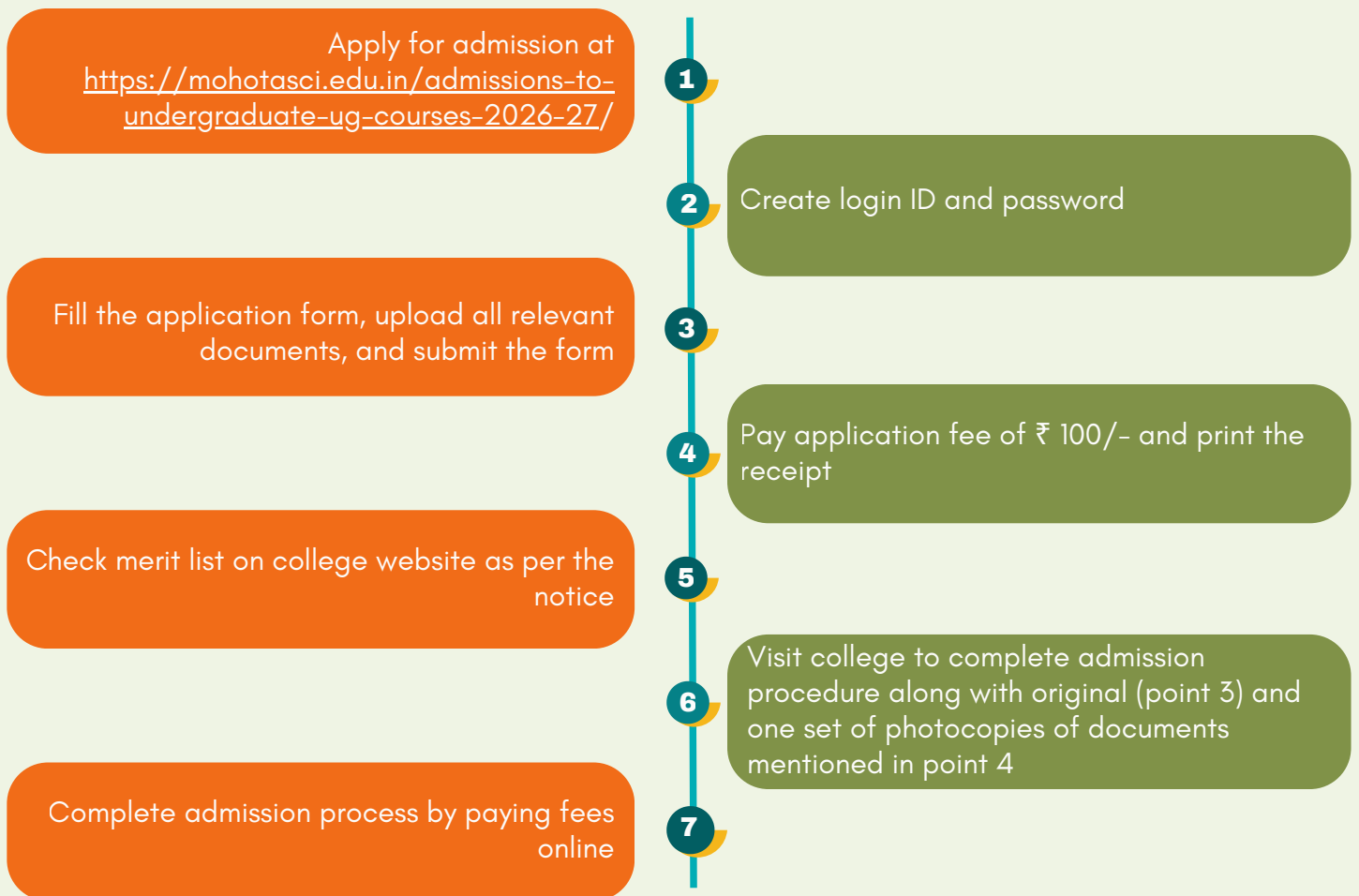
# Admission Information Bulletin

The college offers BSc, BCA, MSc, and PhD programmes. Seven BSc programmes are run on a grant-in-aid basis while eight BSc, BCA, six MSc, and four PhD programmes are self-funded.


The academic session will commence from 16 June 2026 as per the academic calendar published by Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur.

## Undergraduate admission procedure

1. The admission procedure is strictly on merit basis, as per university, government rules and through the college admission committee.
2. The admission process is shown below:



**The students who face difficulties in online registration, can visit the college directly. A helpdesk is set up to assist students for completing all online formalities. This facility is free of cost.**



3. Submission of following **original documents** at the time of taking admission is mandatory:

- Leaving certificate/ TC from the school/ college
- Statement of marks obtained in XII standard
- Anti-ragging undertaking

4. Attach **self-attested photocopies** of the following to the application form:

### **MANDATORY DOCUMENTS**

- Receipt of payment of ₹ 100/- towards registration
- Leaving certificate/ TC from the school/ college
- Statement of marks obtained in XII standard
- X standard passing certificate/ diploma
- *Aadhaar Card*

### **DOCUMENTS WHEREVER APPLICABLE**

- Caste Certificate (for students belonging to SC, ST, NT/ VJ, OBC, SBC, EWS, SEBC)
- Election Photo Identity Card (for students registered as voters)
- Gap certificate (court affidavit stating that the student did not join any other institution after passing last university/ board examination. This affidavit is necessary only if there is a gap of one or more years between passing the last examination and joining the college.)
- Migration certificate in case of students who have passed their last qualifying examination of a university or a board other than RTM Nagpur university or Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education
- Eligibility certificate from RTM Nagpur University for students from university or board other than Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education
- Income certificate of financial year 2025-26 from Gazetted Officer of State Government for students who wish to claim freeship/ scholarship

5. As per the ordinance No. 2 of RTM Nagpur University, Nagpur for admission to a college, the student shall produce the original school/ college leaving certificate signed by the head of the institution/ college last attended. This is required at the time of final admission. The original school/ college leaving certificate will be retained by the college for its permanent record and will not be returned in any case.

6. The reservation of seats for backward class & physically handicapped students will be made as per the government rules and university directives.
7. If the information has been suppressed in the application form and it comes to the notice of the college after admission at any time, the student will be liable to expulsion besides other action as may be deemed fit.
8. The admission to BCA programme will be governed by the university, DTE and government guidelines and students are requested to check the college website for the detailed programme.

# Choice of subjects

The student has to select any one combination for Subject 1, Subject 2 and Subject 3, from Table 2 given below, in semester 1 and 2. Any two subjects selected during first year, will be selected as major and minor subjects in semester 3, 4, and 5. Semester 6 onwards, the student will continue education only in the major subject. # Eligibility for BSc semester I examination

a. The candidate should have passed XII standard examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education/ CBSE/ ICSE, with English at Higher or Lower level and any Modern Indian Language at higher or lower level together with any three science subjects comprised in the Faculty of Science or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto in such subjects and with such standards of attainments as may be prescribed;

OR

b. The candidate should have passed XII standard examination of Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary and offering Education in Vocational/Bi-focal Stream with one language only with any three science subjects comprised in the faculty of Science OR any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto in such subjects and with such standards of attainments as may be prescribed by Minimum Competency Vocational Courses (MCVC).

## Fee structure

The fee structure is subject to change as per government/ university decision from time to time. Every student who is admitted to the college needs to pay tuition fees and other fees for the entire session irrespective of the date of his/ her admission or up to and inclusive of the month of leaving the college. The students desiring to leave the college in the middle of the session must intimate the principal accordingly in writing, otherwise the tuition fees will continue to be charged till the end of the session or the month of giving the intimation whichever is earlier.

The students are requested to visit the college and contact admission committee for details related to fees.




## Refund of deposit

Caution money and library deposits of the students will not be refunded if their names are on the college roll. The student should apply in writing for a refund to the principal after getting it countersigned by his/ her parents or guardian. All such applications will be considered after 1<sup>st</sup> August. The amount to be refunded will be decided after deducting all uncleared dues. Caution money and library deposit due for refund if not claimed within three years, will not be refunded.

## Fees for college leaving and other certificates

1. No fees will be charged for a college leaving certificate, if asked by the student within a year from the date of leaving the college or from the date of the result of the university examination for which the student appeared from the college. After this period a fee of ₹100/- will be charged for every subsequent year subject to a maximum of ₹500/-.
2. The fees as shown below will be charged for each of the following certificates:



Bona fide certificate	₹ 50/-
Attempt certificate for each attempt	₹ 50/-
Date of birth certificate (as per available record)	₹ 50/-
Any other certificate	₹ 50/-

3. Attested copies of the certificate submitted by the student at the time of admission will be issued on payment of ₹ 5/- for each certificate submitted.
4. The student requiring a second copy of the college leaving certificate should state in writing as to what happened to the original certificate and why a second copy is required. A copy of FIR also needs to be submitted. He/ She will have to make an affidavit before a stipendiary magistrate in case the reasons given by the student are not found satisfactory. The student will have to pay fees of ₹ 100/- only for second copy. There is no provision of issue of college leaving certificate for third time.

## Academic Bank of Credits (ABC-ID)

After completing admission to BSc Semester I in college, it is mandatory for all students to create an ABC-ID. Download DigiLocker from Google Play Store. For more details, students may contact Prof. S.K. Giri in the Botany Department.



## Attendance

- According to the NEP 2020 guidelines received from RTM Nagpur University, Nagpur one of the parameters of continuous internal evaluation is attendance and 05 marks are allotted to it.
- Applications submitted for the purpose of leave should be countersigned by the parent or guardian. Medical leave applications should be accompanied by a medical certificate.
- All applications for leave must be submitted within seven days from the last day of the leave period. Applications received later than this will not be considered at all.
- Leaves or absenteeism will be entirely at the student's own risk and a certificate of any kind will not condone a deficiency in attendance required by the university.
- The students getting scholarship or freeship are further warned that their scholarships or freeships will entirely depend on their regular attendance and satisfactory progress in studies. If a student belonging to aforesaid categories fails to put in 75% attendance, he/she will have to pay full fees irrespective of the ground of absence.
- Absence without leave from a college examination will entail a fine of ₹20/- per paper to a maximum of ₹100/- for one examination.

## Short term courses

The college will be conducting nine short term courses which have been approved by the affiliating university. These courses ensure that students gain the ability to exercise contemporary scientific knowledge in small, medium scale industry and service industry.

The fees for these courses are as per the rules and regulations of the Department of Lifelong Learning and Extension, Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur. Students can get themselves enrolled for these courses after the notice is issued by the college.

## Short term/ Government certified courses

Following courses are facilitated by department of computer science for semester I students at a nominal fee of ₹ 600/-. The enrollment to these courses should be finalised at the time of admission.

## Physical education

All students who opt for physical training shall attend the physical training period thrice a week in the prescribed uniform. They shall attend a minimum of 60 periods in a session. The classes will be held as per university and government instructions.

## Medical examination and physical test


- Every student enrolled in the college according to the university rules, must present himself/ herself for medical inspection before the medical officer appointed by the college on such date as may be fixed by the medical officer in consultation with principal. The medical inspection of the students will be held in the premises of the college once a year.
- A student who remains absent from medical examination and physical test at the appointed date and time without any sufficient cause shall be liable to pay to the college an extra medical examination fees of ₹100/- or such smaller amount as the principal may fix before he is examined.
- If a student fails to present himself/ herself for medical inspection without sufficient cause even after repeated opportunities, he/ she will have to pay fine of ₹100/- only.
- All the students admitted to college shall present themselves for physical efficiency test before the committee of examiners as per the schedule.





# Rules of conduct for students

- All the students at the college should observe the rules of conduct framed by the college from time to time. Every day the students must attend the college in proper uniform.
- The students are directly answerable to discipline committee and the principal for their behaviour in general both inside and outside the college.
- The students should behave respectfully with their teachers and politely with their fellow students. Any act of ragging, disobedience, improper and discourteous exchange of words, use of indecent language or the passing of obscene remarks especially at the girl students is a punishable offence and will be viewed seriously. UGC has developed the anti-ragging website i.e. [www.antiragging.in](http://www.antiragging.in). An undertaking is to be mandatorily given by all students during admission, as directed by UGC. - Smoking and chewing tobacco in classroom or college premises is strictly prohibited.
- Students should follow the dress code strictly.
- The use of mobile phone in college premises is strictly prohibited unless it is required for teaching-learning. If it is used in college premises a fine of ₹500/- will be imposed.
- Any change either in the local or permanent address of the student should be informed to the admission clerk so that regular contact with the student, parent or guardian is not hampered.
- No student shall directly send anything concerned with the college for publication either to press or elsewhere without the prior approval and the necessary permission from the principal of the college, nor shall approach the president or the College Development Committee (CDC) members except through the college principal. Any breach of the rule may lead to outright expulsion of the student from the college. The student can discuss their problem with their mentors or contact Grievance Redressal Cell members.

- The students should read the notice board daily for various notices that may be put from time to time.
  - The students shall leave the college premises as soon as their classes are over.
  - No student shall bring any companion with him/ her who is not a student at this college.
  - No excursions or tours shall be arranged by the students without the prior written permission of the principal. The attention of the parents/ guardians is especially invited to the fact that they should not permit their sons/ daughters/ wards to take part in the tour unless they confirm about the permission accorded by the principal.
  - There shall be no social gathering, association, or committees of any sort in the college without due permission from the principal.
  - The student shall also not invite guests or arrange their lectures on their own initiative.
  - The students remaining absent without prior intimation in writing, are liable to be fined.
  - The principal reserves the right to remove from the college roll, the name of any student for conduct which in the opinion of disciplinary committee is unsatisfactory. A student or students may be expelled from the college for any act of indiscipline.
  - Students must pay the college dues, on time, else they will not get their clearance.
  - The student must achieve the academic standard (progress and attendance).
  - Students shall observe all safety precautions. The college is not responsible for accidents of whatever nature in the college, laboratory, playground and during study tours.
  - Students should check the college website for regular updates.

# Government of India Scholarships and Freeships

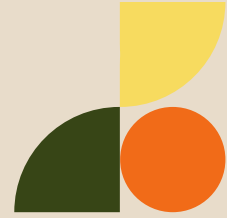
The scholarships are awarded to students as per government rules. Refer the Government Resolution (GR) of Government of Maharashtra dt. 22 March 2021 and 17 January 2022, where the parents' income limit has been raised from ₹ 1 lakh to ₹ 1.5 lakh for the admissible category students (OBC/ SBC/ NT), while for SC/ ST students the income limit is ₹2.5 lakh.

As per the government rules, the income limit for award of freeship to OBC/ EBC/ SBC/ NT students is ₹8 lakh, while there is no upper limit for SC/ ST students.

Students can contact Mrs. Durga Thakre, clerk at the scholarship department, in the office in case of any doubt.

## Career Katta

# Student Welfare Schemes



## Institutional Scholarships

The institute has constituted a scholarship fund for providing scholarships to those selected economically weaker students who are not eligible for any other scholarship from the government. The applications are scrutinized and scholarship is disbursed.

## Institutional Welfare Fund

Established by the donations made by the philanthropists and staff members, this fund is distributed among the economically weaker, minority, and *Divyang* students for their welfare. This includes payment towards college uniforms, participation in activities and events at various levels, scholarships, purchases of practical records, etc.

## Merit Scholarship

Commencing this year, the college will provide merit scholarships to eligible BSc students after declaration of their semester I results.

The college has facilitated a Student Personal Accident Insurance Policy for all admitted students through The New India Assurance Company Limited. This is a mandate by the affiliating university.



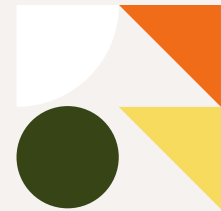
## Earn and Learn

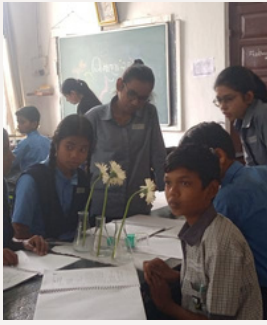
